



INTRODUCTION TO COOBANA

Many of the things we enjoy are produced by hard-working people who receive little money for their crop and often struggle to get by. Every day, farming families make tough choices about which of their needs can and can't be met because the household budget simply won't cover everything.

These resources introduce banana farming and link with the stories from Coobana in Panama that you can find in the Schools Action Guide and on the Fairtrade Foundation Website.

These learning activities for learners aged 8+ give background context to the banana trade, and build learners' understanding of where their food comes from and the work that goes in to producing it.

Activity 1: Introduction

What do we know about bananas?

- Who in the class likes bananas?
- How many do they eat in a week?
- Where do they think bananas come from?
- How much is the cost of a banana? (*currently 11p-18p at supermarkets – Jan 2018*)
- Why do they think bananas are so inexpensive compared to fruit grown in the UK?
- What do they think are some of the issues that may be of concern to consumers in relation to banana production and trade?

You can follow this up explaining that bananas are one of the most consumed and cheapest fruits worldwide: they are the most traded fruit and the fifth most traded agricultural product. Banana Link provides other interesting facts: <http://www.bananalink.org.uk/why-bananas-matter>
